| Missouri Southern State University | <p>A+ Leadership Scholarship http://www.mssu.edu/</p> <p>Eligibility:</p> <p>Available to the first 100 first-time freshmen applicants on a first-come, first served basis.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Must meet admission requirements • Verification of A+ status by transcript or counselor • Must be enrolled as a full-time student(12 credit hours per semester) • Must be a Missouri Resident graduating from an accredited Missouri A+ high school. <p>Amount:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • \$1000 per academic year. • Can be combined with other academic or performance award, not to exceed full tuition and residence hall fees, if living in the residence hall. • Renewable for up to 8 semesters with completion of 12 hours each semester and a GPA of 2.5. |

| Southeast Missouri State | <p>Southeast A+ Scholarship: The Southeast A+ Scholarship is a University-sponsored scholarship. The scholarship requirements and renewal criteria closely relate to those in place for the Missouri A+ Program. The Southeast A+ Scholarship only covers eligible majors. Microcomputer Systems c. Technical Computer <p>2. Associate of Applied Science/Child Care and Guidance</p> <p>The Southeast A+ Scholarship covers:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Incidental and general fees for courses that are part of an eligible program. • Student is responsible for all other charges (textbooks, course fees, room and board, bookstore, parking decal, etc.) and for making payments by the scheduled due dates. • By participating in the Southeast A+ Scholarship Program, the student relinquishes any other University-based merit scholarship(s) intended for incidental and/or general fees. A student may ask to be reconsidered for University-based merit scholarships at a later date, if renewal criteria are met. • The Southeast A+ Scholarship is authorized to cover incidental and general fees, less any Federal Pell Grant award (including Academic Competitiveness Grants), Access Missouri Grant, and/or other awards specifically denoted for incidental and/or general fees. |

| Central Methodist University | <p>A+ Program Scholarship http://www.centralmethodist.edu/ Any student who has completed the A+ program during high school and is admissible will be eligible for a half-tuition scholarship. A transfer student must have maintained A+ eligibility at a junior college or community college. *A+ scholarships need fulfillment documentation from high school.</p> |
| William Woods University | <p>A+ Award- \$1,000 Automatically awarded to applicants who graduate from a Missouri A+ certified high school and have completed the program requirements. Submission of A+ certification and confirmation of participation from the A+ coordinator are required. This award is available to first year freshman and may only be combined with an Academic Excellence Award, an Athletic Award (includes Scholar Athlete Award) and a LEAD Award. Satisfactory academic progress is required for renewal. http://www.williamwoods.edu/</p> |
| Truman State University | <p>A+ Recognition Scholarship http://www.truman.edu/ A student whose high school verifies his/her participation in the A+ program is eligible for consideration for \$1,500 A+ Recognition Scholarship. A maximum of 100 awards will be granted on a competitive basis to candidates who have a minimum 3.3 GPA and a 25 or higher ACT score, or an equivalent SAT exam score. The scholarship will be granted in addition to other University scholarships; the total award package cannot exceed the cost of tuition, room and board plus \$1000 when combined with the "Bright Flight" scholarship.</p> |
| Missouri Valley College | <p>A student is limited to MVC Scholarships not to exceed tuition cost. It is the student's responsibility to inform the Office of Admissions of increased scholarship eligibility. | Northwest Missouri State | <p>A+ Scholarship/Grant -Students admitted into Enhanced Freshman Seminar are NOT eligible for the A+ Scholarship.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • First-time freshman • Attend an A+ eligible Missouri high school • Indicate A+ on Admission Application • Accepted for admission by May 1. • Provide proof of completion of A+ requirements by returning Scholarship/Grant Contract by June 1 • \$1,500 - May receive in addition to other Northwest automatic scholarships. • Renewable for one year by completing 24 credit hours at Northwest during the year with a 3.30 Northwest cumulative GPA. • Limited number awarded http://www.nwmissouri.edu/ |

| Missouri Western State University | <p>A Plus Program This program provides financial assistance to A Plus eligible students who are enrolled in programs of study leading to diplomas, certificates, or associate degrees approved by the Missouri Coordinating Board for Higher Education and the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education. Students must enroll in a minimum of 12 credit hours of approved A Plus classes and maintain a 2.5 cumulative grade point average. This award pays for tuition and common fees.
